A BALM FOR YOUR SOUL: DIRECTED RETREATS IN SILENCE

I have discovered the beauty of spending a full week in silence: the
constant distractions of everyday life gradually recede, leaving a soft,
open space in my soul for God.

The week began with a simple contemplative prayer gathering with the other retreatants, after which we entered silence for the remainder of the retreat. With the exception of daily sessions with a spiritual director, I didn't speak for six full days. Without constant demands for attention, my brain needed time to adjust to being unplugged from sensory overload. I finally "got quiet" sometime on the third day. The silence became a balm for my soul, soothing away the ragged edges of my senses. In the quiet, I found a growing capacity to hear God's gentle invitation into Love. Prayer deepened, moving beyond my usual pleas and petitions, and opening into a newfound spaciousness where God and I could just be. We found each other in walks on the beautiful grounds, in prayerful creativity, in meals taken in silence, as well as in scripture, meditation, and rest.

I invite you to consider making a silent directed retreat this summer. We have two excellent opportunities available, staffed by spiritual directors from our resource list. See page 2 and above for details. If you prefer to schedule a private directed retreat, we can help you make those arrangements too.

REFLECTIONS FROM THE CHAIR *REFLECTIONS?*

My son Carter introduced me to the book series *Game of Thrones*. I've become addicted. Much like J.R.R. Tolkein's Lord of the Rings trilogy, this series takes place in another world... a blend of medieval and fantasy. (Okay, so I'm kind of a geek. I admit it!)

Each of the peoples in the series has its own culture, characteristics, and civilization. One of the things that intrigues me most is the various theologies that each region holds sacred. A few regions are monotheistic, but most worship multiple gods. Many of the main characters worship a set of seven gods: The Father, The Mother, The Crone, The Maiden, The Smith, The Warrior and The Stranger. Each of these gods represents different traits... strength, courage, nurturing, wisdom, etc.

Depending on the situation, characters in the books pray to a specific god or sometimes even two or three of them. It seems as though individual characters keep coming back to the same gods for prayer. The women in the books often pray to The Mother. Knights pray to The Warrior. It usually makes sense that they pray to these "expressions" of their gods, given what's happening to them in the moment. But I wonder if there's something more to it than that. I wonder if these gods are their favorites; the ones they feel most connected with.

Makes me wonder if we do the same thing. What are the faces of God that we worship? Are we drawn to the loving God... the healing God... the jealous God? Do we typically turn to the God of justice or the God of mercy? Do we have our favorites and ignore the other ways that God wishes to interact with our lives?

During this Lenten season, our sermon series has been based on the Beatitudes. Throughout this series, I've been reminded that Jesus' teachings turned the conventional wisdom about God inside out. Time and again, Jesus helped us to see that God... and God's intentions for us were not what most expected. That being the case, what are we missing if we turn only to the faces of God that seem familiar and even comfortable to us?

What would we do differently if we experienced God in His fullness, not just in a thin sliver? What difference would it make in our lives or in the lives of those around us? On May 16, we'll have the opportunity to experience different faces of God by honoring those being recognized at the Living Faith Awards at Capital University. We'll have a chance to see how our God of many faces is making a difference in our lives today. Please join us.

GRIEF, LOSS, AND THE SPIRITUAL JOURNEY

This workshop covers the fundamentals of grief and bereavement—definitions of grief and mourning, phases of the grief process, faces of the grief response, and tasks of healing from grief. It also specifically addresses how to assist a grieving person and how to recognize the dynamics of grief as spiritual crisis and spiritual transformation.

Facilitator: Annie Dalby, LISW-S, is a spiritual director and the Director of Social Work and Bereavement Services for Zusman Hospice in Bexley. She is a graduate of Wellstreams (2009) who feels deeply called to this work and deeply humbled by the beauty and courage of those whom she serves.

DISCOVERING GOD THROUGH THE HORSE-HUMAN CONNECTION

Wednesday, April 10, 7-9:15pm and Saturday, April 20, 10am-12:30pm, \$35

Spiritual directors and those in the helping professions depend on their heart, mind, body, and spirit when they engage with those they companion. Dottie's understanding of these areas comes largely from her personal experience of interacting with horses. Her extensive apprenticeships in equine education and years of working with adults in equine assisted learning insure an experience geared for personal development and authentic relationships. This workshop has two parts. Part one takes place in a classroom setting to explore the implications of equine assisted learning for the spiritual director or companion. Part two will be held at Sugar Lump Farm, Dottie's equine facility in Johnstown. Both sessions are experiential in nature; no previous horse experience is needed, and there is no riding.

Facilitator: Dottie Kluesener obtained her Master of Arts in Education from Ohio State. She is also a graduate of the Wellstreams Training Program for spiritual direction and formation (1998). Dottie has over 15 years of experience of caring for and learning from horses. She is an Eponaquest Advanced Instructor through Epona Equestrian Services of Tucson, Arizona (www.taofequus.com) and a certified Equine Specialist through EAGALA, the national Equine Assisted Growth and Development Association (www.eagala.org).

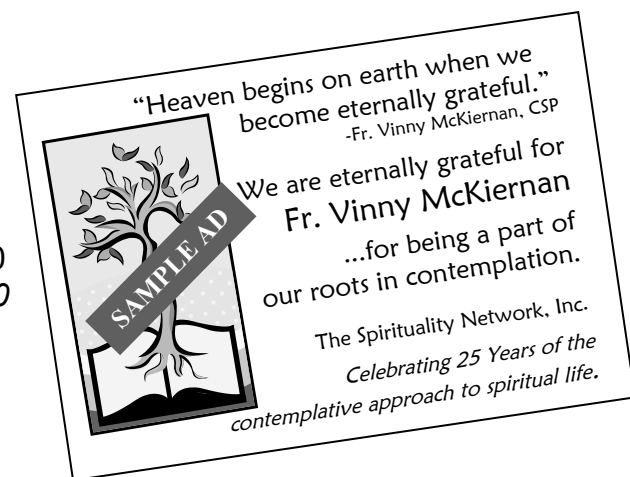

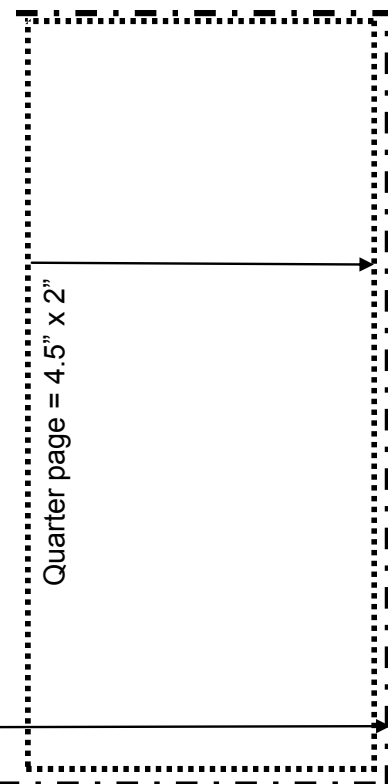
